In answer to your letter 10/08/2005 regarding the presence of foxes in Taxmania, I offer the following answers.

- 1. Yes, I am the author of the letter (photo copy enclosed in your letter)
- No. I have to take their word for it. I have only received the coments of the stomach and was told that it came from a fex, shot in Tasmania.
- 3. The hairs of the Long-tailed Mouse (Pseudomys higgins) were isolated from within the stomach contents. I remember asking for reference hair samples of this species in order to continuous identification. There was a perfect match.
- I have no idea. It is possible that someone in Tasmania might have asked me to send them back to them. All I know is that I am not in possession of the stomach contents.

I hope this is all the information you need.
